He wrote many short stories, poems and reviews. This term paper has not the aim to concentrate on his whole work but to examine a certain story. The writer is especially famous for his “tales of ratiocination” (Carlson 319). One of these stories, “The Murders in the Rue Morgue”, shall be the central subject of this paper. Poe himself commented on this story to be “something in a new key” (Silverman 173). What I want to prove throughout this work is why “Rue Morgue” nowadays signifies not only VPRHWKLQJ that was new, but the prototype of the modern detective story (a thesis we find in most of

the literary encyclopaedias). For reaching a satisfactory final result, it is necessary to have, at first, a look at the definition of the “ short prose narrative” (Ahrends 19), which was given by Poe himself. This term is closely connected to the “ tales of ratiocination” in which the usage of Poe’s primary principles reaches nearly perfection. This “ perfection” is above all to be found in the story “ Rue Morgue” , one of the best examples of Poe’s writing skills and the beginning of the creation of a new establishing literary genre.
